Single Air Transport Market (SAATM)

- ► The Single African Air Transport Market is based on the Yamoussoukro Decision (YD) concept of liberalisation of air transport in Africa which emerged in 1988 with the adoption of the Yamoussoukro Declaration, followed ten years later by the Yamoussoukro Decision (YD) of 1999.
- Based on the need to accelerate the implementation of past and existing continental initiatives for growth and sustainable development.





Grants the free exercises of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th freedom traffic rights to Eligible Airlines

Liberalizes tariffs.

No requirement to obtain approval of tariffs

Allows unrestrictive frequency and capacity.

Eligible African airlines able to fly any intra-African routes Allows designation of Eligible African airline by multinationals

Recognition of community airlines owned by African nationals

Ensures fair competition, consumer protection.

Authority behind the Single African Air Transport Market



The 24th Ordinary Session of the African Union (AU) Assembly/AU/Decl.1(XXIV).

Mindful of its Decision Assembly/AU/Dec.394 (XVIII) on boosting Intra-African Trade and Fast Tracking the Continental Free Trade Area;

Concerned by the slow pace in implementing the Yamoussoukro Decision on the liberalization of air transport markets in Africa;

Aware of the political will shown by a number of States in spearheading the liberalisation of the air transport markets throughout the continent and the need to encourage others to follow suit;





Authority behind the Single African Air Transport Market

3rd meeting of the Ministerial Working Group on establishment of the SAATM took place from 5 to 8 December 2017. It established a framework to oversee and guide implementation of agreed activities and road map for the establishment of a Single African Air Transport Market;

Working Group is composed of Ministers responsible for Air Transport of Member States who have declared their Solemn Commitment to the implementation of the Yamoussoukro Decision towards the establishment of a SAATM.

The African Union Commission (AUC), AFCAC and the Government of the Togolese Republic convened the 4th meeting of the Ministerial Working Group on SAATM which took place in Lome, Togo 25 - 28 May 2018.

SAATM was formally launched on the 28th of January 2018 on the margins of the African Union Summit in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia;

Current members of the Ministerial Working Group, the number of countries that have signed the Solemn Commitment has increased steadily from eleven to twenty-seven;

Expected outcomes/benefits of full implementation of YD and establishment of a SAATM


The African airlines

Airports and Air Navigation service providers
