





IPAB Deployments January 2016



- 6 buoys were deployed during Alfred Wegener Institute (AWI) Polarstern cruise
 PS89/02 in the Weddell Sea, including SVP, IMB, and snow buoys contributed by AWI.
- The Meteorological Services of South Africa, Australia, and New Zealand continue to operationally deploy numerous SVP's in the Southern Ocean, primarily north of the sea ice edge.


Active deployments in the Antarctic










Satellite Retrievals of Ice Motion

- Plan to collaborate with KOPRI and deploy buoys from R/V Araon.
