- Hong Kong is one of the busiest ports in the world.
- Over 100 ocean-going ships enter the port everyday
- In 1949, Hong Kong Observatory began to recruit a fleet of locally based voluntary weather observing ships to report weather conditions at sea.





Hong Kong Voluntary Observing Ship (HKVOS)


- Total Number of HKVOS (8 June 2015): 61
 - 52 Selected
 - 8 Voluntary Observing ship Climate (VOSClim)
 (support global climate and research)
 - 1 supplementary





- 2 Selected ships were installed with AWS
 - AMOS (UKMet Office)
 - Drifter buoy (MetOcean Surface Velocity Program (SVP))











• 8 ships







- Recruitment of ships to take part in the Voluntary Observing Ships' scheme;
- Regular liaison with recruited ships to ensure the highest standard of weather observations;
- All barometers calibrated against Vaisala PTB330 digital barometer which in turn is compared with an international standards
- Interface between the meteorological service and the marine community.

• Deployed on 26 June 2015

















Trial launching of radiosondes onboard HKVOS


• Launched 7 radiosonde over South China Sea from 14 –17 June 2015


