The need for coordination mechanism

- Regional coordination mechanism serves to connect national actions to global commitments and partnerships supporting sustainable level for all.
- The need for coordination increases directly with the amount of reciprocal inter-dependance among stakeholders.
- The Regional Association VI is responsible for the coordination of meteorological, hydrological and related activities within the Region VI (Europe).



Regional coordination mechanisms

Components to success?

- POLICY: Not merely "technical" developments and cooperation, but also "policy" development and cooperation are needed for sharing commonly beneficial systems, information and services.
- INSTITUTIONAL: A regional institution, linked to national institutions for the common good.
- FINANCIAL: There needs to be a development—oriented commitment for success. The United Nations is not a rich financier. Every one - a donor of diverse ideas! Everyone - a beneficiary of other's ingenuity.


