INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE WORKING GROUPS

- The participants will be divided into parallel working groups during session 4 of the Training Workshop (14:30 to 18:00 on March 24th, and 09:00 to 10:30 on March 25th)
- The working groups will be composed of 15-20 experts. A list of the composition of the Working groups will be shared at the Workshop.
- The working groups are tasked to:
 - 1. Review and analyze national early warning systems (EWS) capacities, gaps and needs of the participating countries and highlight priority areas for the development of EWS in each country;
 - 2. Discuss concrete areas of regional cooperation to support national EWS capacities;
 - 3. Prepare recommendations for priorities of action for the development/strengthening of national EWS and concrete areas for regional cooperation.
- Each working group will be moderated by a facilitator, who will be supported by two rapporteurs and a WMO Secretariat staff.

Guidelines for the participants in the working groups:

- In preparation for the working group discussions, all national participants are kindly requested to coordinate to respond to the questionnaire (Doc 5b) on the status of their EWS in their respective countries, prior to the Workshop.
- Please complete this questionnaire electronically, through a consultative process that involves the National Disaster Risk Management Agency, National Meteorological and Hydrological Service and other relevant agencies and stakeholders involved in EWS in your country.

- The responses to questionnaire will be used as the basis for the discussions during the Working Groups
- All participants should bring a hard copy and an electronic version of the completed questionnaire to the Workshop.
- The responses will be compiled to support the drafting of the Working Groups reports.

Guidelines for the Facilitators and Rapporteurs of the Working Groups:

- Facilitators and Rapporteurs are invited to a coordination and briefing meeting on Tuesday 23 March 2010 at 8:00 AM at the venue of the workshop to discuss goals and format of the Working Groups. Room number of this meeting will be announced at the meeting:
- Facilitators will moderate the working groups to ensure an interactive session
- Questionnaire (Doc 5b) will be used as basis for discussions. Facilitator will pose questions from the questionnaire and will invite all participating countries to respond and discuss their situation
- Power Point <u>Presentations by countries are discouraged</u> in light of the limited time.
- The Rapporteurs are expected to document the key issues raised during the Working Groups discussions. A Secretariat staff will assist the Facilitator and the Rapporteurs to document the outcomes of the discussions systematically and prepare the Working Group report and Presentation for the plenary discussions.
