# Hotels

Each participant, funded by WMO, will receive a lump sum to cover accommodation, meals and airport transportation costs.

# Transportation

Participants will be responsible for coordinating their own transportation to and from the airport. At the airport, free tickets for public transport within the Canton of Geneva are available from the machine in the Baggage Conveyor Hall before passing customs. Hotels in Geneva are providing guests with a free ticket for public transport.

### Getting to WMO from the airport

Taxi: From the taxi rank outside the Arrivals Hall (Ground floor). Cost: approximately CHF 25 to 30

**Bus/Tram:** The WMO can be reached by bus lines 1, 11, 25 and 28 heading to "Jardin Botanique" or by tram 15 to "Nations". Buses 1 and 25 and tram 15 stop in front of the main train railway station "Cornavin"; bus 11 can be taken from the Place des Nations (connection to tram 15). Bus 28 connects the WMO building to the airport and can be taken from outside the Terminal Building (first floor). The stop is situated to the left as you come out of the terminal. The bus goes all the way to Jardin Botanique, which faces the WMO building (last stop).

### Getting to WMO from the centre of Geneva

From Cornavin Station, tram 15 goes to the Place des Nations. WMO is then within walking distance (avenue de la Paix, towards the lake – 10 minutes). Buses 1, 11 and 28 also stop at the Jardin Botanique.

### **Currency and banks**

The currency in Switzerland is the Swiss Franc (CHF, SFr.). The Euro is also accepted at most businesses but expect to pay a premium rate. Check www.xe.com for the most up-to-date exchange rates. Most transactions in the city are conducted in cash and a surprising number of businesses and restaurants do not accept credit cards so be prepared. ATMs are widely available throughout the city, dispensing notes up to 1000 CHF.

### Weather in Geneva

Due to the tempering effects of the lake and surrounding mountains, Geneva is pleasant almost year round. September and October are the rainiest months. January and February are the coldest but rarely drop below freezing. Summers are long with relatively low humidity and cool breezes from the lake. The Mont Blanc is visible from Geneva about half of the days out of the year. ### **Electrical Voltage**

Electricity in Switzerland is 220 volts, 50 cycles AC. Most U.S. American appliances require a converter and an adapter to operate, although some dual-voltage items such as laptops may only require an adapter. Some European appliances may also require an adapter as Switzerland uses a 3-prong outlet smaller than continental information svstem that is most plugs.
